The Banach spaces L^1 and L^∞ :

Hilbert space and L^2 spaces:

Bessel's inequality, orthonormal basis, and Parseval's identity
Trigonometric series: *trigonometric polynomials are dense in both $C([0, 1])$ (with respect to the uniform metric) and in $L^2([0, 1])$*
